In 2022, the Empower Simcoe Board of Directors approved our strategic plan, marking the beginning of an exciting journey for our agency. We are incredibly proud of the significant strides we have made in pursuit of our three key priorities: Service Excellence, Our People and Culture, and Strong Partnerships.

Priority #1: Service Excellence

Service Excellence has been the cornerstone of our unwavering dedication to providing quality customer service. We are thrilled to announce the completion of a specialized transition home in Orillia, designed to empower individuals in developing essential social and living skills. We've optimized our housing stock to align with the goals of those we support, and the launch of fee-for-service (FFS) programs has brought immense benefits to the people and families we support and the community alike. In 2024, our integration of Microsoft platform technologies like Power BI, Power Apps, Power Automate, and SharePoint has greatly improved our ability to track key performance indicators, streamline passport budget management, and enhance operational efficiency. In addition, the introduction of a content submission portal for employee engagement and the inclusion of profile photos on internal platforms have significantly elevated communication within our organization.

Priority #2: Our People and Culture

The tireless efforts of our Empower Simcoe People and Culture team have led to the successful launch of a comprehensive orientation program for new employees, aimed at fostering a deep understanding of our services and strengthening our organizational culture and values. We are delighted to have offered diverse training programs, including Essential Skills for Today's Leadership, Direct Support Leadership, and Conflict Management. Furthermore, our listening and brainstorming sessions on customer service and equity, diversity, and inclusion have contributed to a more inclusive workplace environment.

Priority #3: Strong Partnerships

At Empower Simcoe, we deeply understand the importance of forging strategic partnerships. Our collaboration with the Intentional Community Consortium and the Local Immigration Partnership is a testament to this unwavering commitment.

These partnerships have allowed us to advocate for supportive housing and the National Housing Strategy on Parliament Hill and present our services and job opportunities to newcomers in Simcoe County and beyond. In collaboration with developmental services agencies and experts in Simcoe County, we have developed an Emergency Management and Pandemic Response Plan for congregate care settings. This comprehensive plan, coupled with an annual tabletop exercise, plays a pivotal role in ensuring the safety and well-being of the people and families we support, along with our employees, during unforeseen circumstances. The extraordinary progress achieved over the past year serves as a testament to the unwavering dedication of Empower Simcoe's leadership team and employees. With one more year left in our strategic plan, our commitment has never been stronger.










SOURCES OF REVENUE (IN 000'S)


Trevor was born with Down Syndrome in 1978, and throughout his life, Empower Simcoe has been there to guide and encourage him to live his best life. "Empower Simcoe's Preschool program launched its Infant Development Program just before Trevor was born," said Kathy McCarroll, Trevor's Mom. "Trevor was the first baby into that program from the beginning. I don't know what we would have done without these services, the resources that were made available to us, and how to work with special needs."

As a toddler, Trevor joined Sunny Park Children's Centre, now the EarlyON Child and Family Centre. After graduating high school, Trevor started working with the YMCA of Simcoe/Muskoka and volunteered at a retirement home, folding laundry and assisting with cleaning.

As someone who's received services from Empower Simcoe his entire life, it was only fitting, during the agency's 70th anniversary year, that Trevor represent Empower Simcoe, by dropping the ceremonial puck at the 2023 Boots and Hearts Barn Burner Hockey Game. In front of a sold-out crowd at the Sadlon Centre in Barrie, hockey legends Darryl Sittler, and Barn Burner captains John Tavares and Gary Roberts joined Trevor at center ice. Trying on Darryl's Hockey Hall of Fame ring before the game was an unforgettable highlight for Trevor.

However, Darryl was more impressed that Trevor is a Dr. Frank Hayden Lifetime Achievement Award recipient from Special Olympics Ontario for his remarkable dedication to Special Olympics for more than thirty years.

A LIFETIME OF MEANINGFUL ACHIEVEMENT

Helping people and his community just comes naturally to Jeff Czetwerzuk. As an Empower Simcoe Supported Independent Living Worker and Ward 3 Councillor for the City of Orillia, Jeff explains the parallels between the two positions.



"It's really about helping and supporting people of all abilities in our community," says Jeff. I'm passionate about that."

Born and raised in Orillia, Jeff's commitment to community service started in grade six as a volunteer with Special Olympics bowling. "Many people I now support as a SIL Worker recognize me as that 11-year-old from bowling," says Jeff. "It's heartwarming to see things come full circle."

Following his roots, Jeff pursued a Child and Youth Care diploma from Georgian College, which was succeeded by an Honors Bachelor of Social Work degree from Lakehead University. His passion for politics flourished during his time as a student leader, having been elected to the Georgian College Student Association and the Georgian College Board of Governors.

Jeff's journey with Empower Simcoe began as a summer student, leading to being hired eventually as a member of the Empower Simcoe Supported Independent Living team. On any given day, he assists people with grocery shopping, attending doctor's appointments, cooking, support around one's home, banking, and accessing the community.

"The people we support are so thankful to have an extra set of hands to help them with their daily lives," notes Jeff. "They really appreciate the work we do." Elected to Orillia City Council in 2022, Jeff is committed to serving the citizens of Orillia, just like the people he supports at Empower Simcoe, by being involved in the community, being responsive, and being committed to creating positive change.



AN UNWAVERING COMMITMENT TO COMMUNITY SERVICE

There's a palpable focus and a sense of purpose from participants at the weekly Fibre Friends table at the Ramara Centre Library. As part of Empower Simcoe's Community Support Services program, this drop-in beginner's knitting class meets weekly to support and encourage each other at whatever stage they might be at with their knitting projects. This is a stitch and social where participants gather to laugh and share ideas and their love of knitting.



Watching Hailey Mackie, one can't but be impressed and inspired by her determination and progress as she skillfully loops a piece of colourful yarn around each peg of her adaptive loom. Due to a weaker right hand, Hailey originally had challenges maneuvering the knitting needles; however, thanks to the ingenuity of Empower Simcoe Community Support Services Support Worker Cortney Moreau, Hailey is now crushing it one stitch at a time.

Much research by Cortney went into finding an adaptive loom design that would best fit Hailey's needs. With the assistance of Cortney's handy husband, Mike, a knitting loom was thoughtfully custom-built and assembled to allow Hailey to knit on her own.

Now, Hailey is creating beautiful, knitted apparel she loves and building connections and a sense of belonging with other community members.

"I like being around people," says Hailey. "Knitting is such a fun and relaxing thing to do."

Hailey continues to learn new patterns and plans to sew her creations together to make a beautiful new patch blanket. She promises to share a picture with Empower Simcoe upon completing the project.

"I'm excited to be working towards this goal," exclaims Hailey.




EMPOWER SIMCOE FOUNDATION FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS 2023-2024 (IN 000'S)
